BA Anthropology – Hons

Objective:

The B.A. Anthropology (Hons.) programme of KIIT, Deemed to be University, is a three years Bachelors' program in Anthropology. The educational objective of the course is to provide students with a strong foundation in the discipline of Anthropology. Along with core papers, discipline specific papers familiarize students with both theoretical and application based aspects of the discipline of Anthropology. The curriculum covers upcoming and updated papers in Anthropology, all of which prepare students to be future ready. The program focuses on developing in students an understanding of the theoretical concepts of Anthropology. Alongside there is also a focus on developing certain skills which will enable students to pursue higher education or/and work in clinical or social settings.

Pedagogy:

The program's teaching methodology and approach are designed to leverage technology and maximise interaction seamlessly and simultaneously. The program follows an eclectic pedagogy comprising of lectures, practicum, classroom discussions and presentations. All these are designed with the aim of developing critical thinking in students.

Curriculum:

The duration of the BA Anthropology is three academic years split into six semesters with a total of 146 credits. The above course curriculum includes Core papers (Codes: 01 – 29); Ability Enhancement papers (Codes: 31 – 39); Generic Elective papers (Codes: 41 – 49); Skill Enhancement papers (Codes: 51 – 59); Discipline Specific Elective (Codes: 61 – 79); and Sessional/Practical papers (Codes: 81 – 99).
